As many of you know, the summer months found me working on my dissertation, a document carefully planned last summer and approved by the Doctoral Committee at Andover Newton Theological School in December. With seven of the nine chapters completed in first draft form, my advisor and I are happy with this progress, the paper's completion and refinement an effort that will be ongoing in the months to come.

But there's another side to this sabbatical: the journey of faith that was part of each step. While I didn't travel to the historic sites of our faith tradition, I was excavating fascinating data, my appreciation of the apostles and writers of our scriptures added to at every turn. Delving into the Gospel of John, my faith was deepened, my understanding of the stories transformed by a greater knowledge of why and for whom they were written. We are a part of a great tradition! Just as John and Peter and the other early disciples worked to share the story and love of Jesus, so do *we* now!

It's with such invigoration and joy that we are reunited. I hope you, too, had an enriching summer, and I thank you for your faithfulness these months. I'm especially grateful to Cindy Lou Benson for managing the church so well in conjunction with our Co-Moderators, Al Gledhill and Lorrie Herzberg, Senior Deacon, Nancy Fergus, and The Rev. John Brock for his strong leadership and ministry. With the new year beginning we have much to be grateful for, and it all begins with the gift of life and love. May we treasure each day with God and one another. Amen and alleluia!

## **NEIGHBORS IN NEED COLLECTION DRIVE**

The annual Neighbors-In-Need (NIN) Offering will be received on Sunday, October 2nd. It supports the United Church of Christ's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States.

Two thirds of the offering is used by the Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a variety of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties and environmental justice as well as direct service projects.

The other third of the offering is used to support the work of the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban multi-tribal UCC Congregation in Minneapolis. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM which also serves as a valuable resource for more than 1,000 individuals and dozens of other tribes in the U.S.

## BRISTOL LODGE FOOD KITCHEN

Fall is the time for Payson Park Church to renew its commitment to serving the local men and women who visit the Bristol Lodge Food Kitchen in Waltham for a daily hot meal. For many years now, we have been providing a monthly meal for people who are very grateful for the nutritious meal as well as the fellowship and shelter. By volunteering to cook a meal for 12 people, help in serving the meal or donating cash toward the grocery expenses, you may assist in this community outreach effort.

Are you seeking ways to serve people in need in your area? Do you shop and cook? Do you have a few extra dollars after your weekly expenses? Can you spare a couple of hours, once a month? Do you enjoy the fellowship of church friends and grateful people? If so, please consider joining the faithful church volunteers who cook and serve a hot meal, once a month, to approximately 75 men and women at a church in Waltham. The Bristol Lodge Food Kitchen serves a daily hot meal to needy people, not all of whom are homeless, and we have been volunteering there for many years. Here's how it works: You can volunteer for once or twice a year or for every month. Sign up on the Mission bulletin board (next to the church office) and take a recipe. Buy the groceries needed to feed 12 people and prepare the recipe at home. The recipes are easy and the costs range from \$20-\$28. Deliver the food to Waltham or someone else can do it for you. Serve the meal if you are available. Feel good in knowing that you have reached out to your neighbors and that you have nourished them.

WISDOM TALES

STORYTELLING IN RELIGIOUS SETTINGS

Elisa Pearmain is scheduled to speak in worship and in church school on October 30. Elisa has been telling stories in churches for over twenty years. Her first book *Doorways to the Soul: 52 Wisdom Tales from around the World* (1998) contains 52 short tales from different spiritual, religious and folk traditions designed to be read one per week with exercises to deepen our connection to the wisdom in the stories, and to foster personal and spiritual growth. 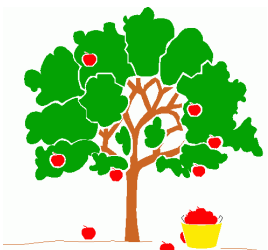
