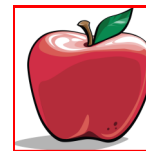

Are you seeking way to serve people in need in your area? Do you shop and cook? Do you have a few extra dollars after your weekly expenses? Can you spare a couple of hours, once a month? Do you enjoy the fellowship of church friends and grateful people? If so, please consider joining the faithful church volunteers who cook and serve a hot meal, once a month, to approximately 75 men and women at a church in Waltham. The Bristol Lodge Food Kitchen serves a daily hot meal to needy people, not all of whom are homeless, and we have been volunteering there for many years. Here's how it works: You can volunteer for once or twice a year or for every month. Sign up on the Mission bulletin board (next to the church office) and take a recipe. Buy the groceries needed to feed 12 people and prepare the recipe at home. The recipes are easy and the costs range from \$20-\$28. Deliver the food to Waltham or someone else can do it for you. GOD'S GARDEN, GROWING IN FAITH

A MESSAGE FROM THE

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION DIRECTOR

This year in God's Garden our theme is very exciting and can be found all throughout the Bible. The theme built on the concept of building (no pun intended). We will work with the building idea throughout the year in God's Garden and reflect on it often.

In the fall we will start one of the many service projects planned this year with a lesson titled "Build A House" from Susan Lingo's *101 Simple Service Projects Kids Can Do*. The lesson refers to the scripture from Corinthians 3 "*We can work together to build good things.*" This service project is a hands-on one kids will love! They will be building unusual birdhouses and use them to collect change at home for the church school collection – Heifer. Heifer helps build community by helping to end world hunger. We will celebrate this unit with a scheduled visit to the Heifer farm in Rutland on Sunday, October 10. Also in the fall we are having a lesson on the parables called The Wise and the Foolish. It will focus on the scripture from Matthew "... *it did not fall because it had its foundation on the rock.*" In the art workshop they will create stepping stones in their building lesson. The science workshop will show why it is important to build on a solid foundation to weather life's storms. That foundation is the Word of God.

In the winter the children will come to understand Our Church's Wider Mission with a lesson on the mission offering called One Great Hour of Sharing. This message builds on God's message of love and hope.

In the spring we prepare for Easter with a Lenten lesson on communion. The youth of God's Garden will be encouraged to attend the Maundy Thursday service during Holy Week. The school year will end with a lesson building on the Lord's Prayer.

As we read in Corinthians, *we can work together to build good things* and the children too will learn that serving others can be fun and also help build relationships. You may often hear the term QUAK! QUAK = Quick Acts of Kindness. One of the things I love about our many joy-filled service projects is that we will help the children to start thinking of serving God as a daily joy instead of an occasional times.

We are collecting household items. Please consider donating a needed item to the school's fall program: toy baby dolls (like new), match box cars, baby food jars: glass or plastic, large glass jars (mayo size), empty applesauce cups, pencils and pens. A box will be placed in the office for the collection. Thank you for your support. *Cindy Lou Benson*
